

VASHTI

- You can read about Vashti in Esther 1 or listen here.
- In Modern Persian Vashti means beauty / goodness
- In Old Persian it most likely means best /excellent
- Vashti is the first wife of King Ahasuerus.
- When her husband hosts a banquet for the men, Vashtí holds a separate one for the women.
- Vashti refuses her husband's order to parade her beauty before the men at the banquet.
- Ahasuerus dismisses Vashti and, after selection period, she is replaced by Esther



Ahaseurus banishes Vashti Marc Chagall (Fair Use)

- You might like to read Esther I once more and pause at a word or phrase that strikes you.
- Meditate over this word or phrase with God until you come to a point of stillness.
- What do you sense God's invitation to you might be and how do you want to respond?
- As you finish your time of prayer you might like to thank God for the life of Vashti.
- What God has to teach you through the life of Vashti?
- You might like to close your time of prayer by praying the Lord's Prayer.

- At some point this week you might like to pray practically with the narrative of Vashti.
- You could do this through collage, poetry, bible art journalling, or another creative approach.
- You might like to take a bowl of uncooked rice mixed with pasta shapes.
 - As you sift through the grains and shapes consider what areas of oppression you see in your own context.
 - How might God be calling you to intercede or act in these areas?
 - How would you like God to help you do this?
