- You might like to read Isaiah 6 or listen to it here.
- Isaiah means God is Salvation
- Isaíah was a prophet in the 8th century BC
 - He prophesied through the reigns of 4 kings of Judah possibly for about 64 years.
 - We read many of his prophecies over the Advent and Christmas period
- In Isaiah 6 we hear of his call by God
 - He is overwhelmed by the glory and holiness of God
 - He is aware of his sin
 - His guilt is taken away and atoned for
 - He says to God 'here I am, send me'
 - · He is commissioned by God
- As you read about Isaiah, what do you notice?



- You might like to read the passage once more and pause at a word or phrase that strikes you.
- Meditate over this word or phrase with God until you come to a point of stillness.
- What do you sense God's invitation to you might be and how do you want to respond?
- As you finish your time of prayer you might like to thank God for the life and writing of Isaiah and what God has to teach you through it.
- You might like to close your time of prayer by praying the Lord's Prayer.
