- You might like to read more of the narratives of Elisha in 2 Kings, starting at chapter 2, and of his call in 1 Kings 19:19
- Elisha means God is my salvation
- Elisha was a prophet who received the mantle of Elijah
 - He saw Elijah taken up to heaven in a chariot of fire
 - He asked and received a double portion of Elijah's spirit
 - Many of the miracles performed through him resonate with the miracles of Christ
 - He is mentioned in Luke 4:27
 - As you read about Elisha, what do you notice?



- You might like to read the story once more and pause at a word or phrase that strikes you.
- Meditate over this word or phrase with God until you come to a point of stillness.
- What do you sense God's invitation to you might be and how do you want to respond?
- As you finish your time of prayer you might like to thank God for the life of Elisha and what God has to teach you through it.
- You might like to close your time of prayer by praying the Lord's Prayer.
