
Lazarus

- Lazarus is derived from the Hebrew, God has helped.
- Lazarus was the brother of Mary and Martha.
 - He lived in Bethany.
 - He was greatly loved by Jesus.
 - Jesus wept by his tomb.
 - After being dead for four days Jesus raised Lazarus.
 - Lazarus was present at the meal in John 12 where Mary poured nard over the feet of Jesus.

- You might like to find a stone to remind you of the stone that blocked the entrance to Lazarus' tomb.
- As you hold the stone you might like to ask God what blocks are there in your life to the freedom Christ offers. How might God be offering to remove or dislodge these blocks?
