
Praying through the Gospel of Mark

Station 20 - take courage, it is I

- Find a place to sit quietly.
- Sit in a relaxed position
 - Become aware of your feet on the floor.
 - Notice your legs. Tense and relax your muscles.
 In the same way notice the rest of your body, bit by bit. Tense and relax.
 - Lastly focus on your face and head muscles.
 Tense and relax.
 - Scan your body.
 - Notice any points of remaining tension. Tense and relax.
 - Let any remaining tension go.
 - Come to a place of rest.
- Be aware of God's loving eyes watching over you.
- As we Journey with Jesus ask God for the grace to notice his presence with you in all things.



- Many people find repetitive prayer helpful in leading into a stillness before God
 - Repeating The Jesus Prayer slowly and prayerfully is one way
 - > Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the Living God, have mercy on me a sinner
 - Repeating words of the Lord's Prayer slowly and prayerfully is another way
 - > Your kingdom come on earth as it is in heaven
- Toining Michael Smith repeating in song the words <u>Let it Rain</u> is another way You might like to continue to enter our time of prayer in one of these ways

Read this passage from Mark chapter 6. What words or phrases strike you?


How has the Spirit been at work in your heart as you have prayed?

Creative prayer
