- Gamaliel means the Lord is my reward
- Gamaliel was a member of the Sanhedrin in the first century CE
 - He has a reputation in the Mishnah for being one of the greatest teachers in Judaism
 - He was honoured by the people
 - He acted with wisdom and trust in God
 - He was the grandson of Hillel the Elder
 - Paul learned at his feet (Acts 22:3)
- As you read about Gamaliel, what do you notice?
